Cape Eleuthera Resort & Yacht Club Eleuthera, Bahamas

Boasting one of the largest marinas in the Out Islands of The Bahamas, the new \$85 million Cape Eleuthera Resort & Yacht Club is situated on a private 4,500-acre peninsula on Eleuthera Island and features two-bedroom luxury townhome resort accommodations lining the marina.

Located less than 220 miles off the east coast of Florida, the Cape Eleuthera resort and real estate project is being developed by the DeVos family who formerly owned Peter Island in the British Virgin Islands. It is an ideal setting for world-renowned sport fishing, boating or simply relaxing on secluded beaches.

Cape Eleuthera is not for everyone, said David Green, managing director. It will never be a Las Vegas style resort transplanted in the Caribbean, but our guests are able to enjoy an authentic, Bahamian Out Island experience and that is what makes us so appealing. Green also notes that due to the immense land size, no other resorts or developments on the island will encroach upon the Cape Eleuthera development, ensuring guests always have a natural environment to explore.

The Cape Eleuthera Yacht Club boasts the longest Mega Yacht Dock on Eleuthera at more than 450 feet and features a wide flushing channel to ensure a gin-clear marina basin and protection against surge. The marina also accommodates vessels larger than 200 feet with depths up to 35 feet and currently holds 55 slips with a potential capacity of up to 200.

Vacationers stay along the marina in two-bedroom townhomes blending the authentic Caribbean way of life with contemporary amenities and a design that mirrors the architectural details found on many of the original island homes. Complete with spacious living areas, luxurious four-poster beds, fully appointed kitchens and washer and dryer, the townhomes have all the luxuries of being at home with the benefits of staying at a resort. Private porches and balconies overlook the marina and command views of the sunset and sunrise. Visitors take in understated elegance, sensible luxury and the natural beauty of Eleuthera.

Fishing, diving, kayaking, sailing and snorkeling are among the many adventures of a Cape Eleuthera guest. Fishermen find a plethora of trophy-size game fish -- everything from dolphin, tuna, sailfish, wahoo, and marlin -- off the coast of south Eleuthera, and find themselves in one of the world's best locations for bone fishing. Guests set off by boat or kayak to explore the Schooner Cays four small, uninhabited islands that appear to be floating in the sky. Caribbean and Bahamas diving

Divers discover several dive sites among miles of underwater walls, caves and caverns in the resort's neighboring cays, as well as abundant sea life and enchanting shipwrecks.

While on land, guests and enjoy the freedom to explore the many trails and hidden coves of Cape Eleuthera by golf cart, bicycle or on foot, soaking in the warm Bahamian sun on the sands of Sunset or Sunrise Beach and jumping off of the cliffs at High Rock into the warm waters of south Eleuthera.
