Bimini Bay Resort and Marina, located on North Bimini, is only one to two hours by boat from South Florida, and the closest point in the Bahamas from the U.S. Bimini Bay offers boaters the opportunity to experience the Bahamas in the lap of luxury with two full service marinas, beautiful luxury suites and villas, and an array of upscale amenities surrounded by white sandy beaches and emerald waters. It doesn't get any better or more convenient than this.

Guests of Bimini Bay Resort and Marina enjoy use luxurious accommodations and amenities like an infinity pool overlooking the Atlantic Ocean and various fine dining options. The mega yacht marina features 96 floating marina slips which can accommodate mega yachts up to 203 feet (slips are available for rental or purchase).

The recently dredged channel allows mega yachts to easily cruise down and gracefully arrive at Bimini Bay Resort where first-class dockside utilities and amenities welcome them.

The resort's original marina features 136 floating marina slips, accommodating yachts from 40 feet to 130 feet.

The resort offers a long list of activities for children and adults ranging from Spa Chakra Bimini (opening winter 2009) to a children's playground and activity center and tennis and bocce ball courts. You can also hone your fishing skills with guided flats fishing trips and deep sea boat charters. Bimini features some of the best snorkeling and scuba diving sites in the Caribbean and scuba and snorkeling rentals are available by contacting the resort. Don't miss sites including the Wreck of the Sapona, a shipwreck in only 14 feet of water, as well as the Lost City of Atlantis and other remarkable spots.

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Visiting boaters can also enjoy the convenience of Fisherman's Village, the resort's shopping plaza with a variety of stores, located beside the marina. Future facilities include a boating supply store, location of Spa Chakra Bimini, Bristol Liquors, a dive and adventure shop, and gas station.

Dining at Bimini Bay is a treat with several options including the resort's Aquagrille, located poolside offering lunch and dinner with island favorites from fresh cracked conch to mango daiquiris. Casa Lyon, the resort's fine dining restaurant is housed in a \$1.8 million remodel of an historic home that features an outside original deck over-

looking the Atlantic Ocean. Opening in January 2009 is Sabór, the island's first Mediterranean-inspired restaurant where guests can listen to the waves crash against the shore while feasting on ceviche and other dishes.

Boaters also have the option to stay on land in one of Bimini Bay's fine suites or villas designed with beachy chic in mind and offering 360 degree views of the ocean and bay. There are currently 200 suites and villas including one, two and three-bedroom full-service suites; one and three-bedroom treehouses and ocean/bayfront villas, all complete with the comforts of your own home.
